

Nate White Inducted into USATF Masters Hall of Fame

We're proud and delighted to report that the late Nate White has been enshrined in the USATF Masters Hall of Fame in its Class of 2008. Notice of Nate's selection-in the "Old-Timers" (posthumous) category-came in late November, and his induction was effective as of its public announcement at this year's USATF Annual Convention on December 5th.

As many CNY runners know, Nate was both an outstanding age-group athlete and one of the most significant figures in the history of the CNY running community. Name won numerous national championships, both individual and team, competing as a Charger during four decades, and he still holds a long list of Chargers age-group records. Nate served twelve years (1982 through 1994) as president of the Chargers, during which he was recognized by the Road Runners Club of America with the 1990 Hamilton Award as the nation's most outstanding running club president. Nate was also an active and well-respected member of the TAC and USATF Masters Long Distance Running Committee, which recognized both Nate and Evelyn with the 1986 Otto Essig Award for meritorious Service to Masters Long Distance Running.
